24TH & **25**TH **JUNE** Palais de la Musique et des Congrès

25TH JUNE - GALA EVENING Maillon theatre

Inaugurated in November 2019, close to the Palais de la Musique et des Congrès, this new theatre building offers a large, friendly reception hall combining greenery and wood, an open patio and modular spaces. Designed as a place for experimentation, it brings together theatre and contemporary creation.



26TH JUNE European Parliament

For the closing plenary session of the event, delegates will have the opportunity to sit in the Hemicycle of the European Parliament, where European Union legislation is debated and voted.

2nd Zero Energy Exclusion Territories (TZEE) Campus

As part of the national programme 'Territoires Zéro Exclusion Énergétique', an annual event is organised by the association 'Stop exclusion énergétique': the Campus for territories.

Among the laureates of the programme, the City and Eurométropole of Strasbourg will host this second campus at the same time and next to the European Conference on Energy Transition. The aim is to bring together various local players to learn from each other and create a multi-stakeholder community whose concrete expectations are:

- At the local level: share how they have implemented the programme in their region (what were local specificities, adaptations, etc.), the progress they have made, difficulties they have encountered, what they consider to be the conditions for success and what future steps they aim to take.
- At the national level: involve national partners (ANAH, Capeb, Qualibat, FFB, AFAP...) to listen to in the field stakeholders and support the programme and its ambition to scale up and meet tomorrow's challenges alongside local players.
- Develop the co-construction of a reference tool to share and capitalize on experience.



Careers fair on energy transition

A careers fair on energy transition will take place during the Conference to highlight the wide range of jobs in tomorrow's fair and innovative transition.

Professionals themselves will present a **wide** range of professions, requiring different levels of training.

Bringing together **local players** in the fields of **training** and **employment**, as well as professionals from local and national companies, this forum is aimed at pupils, students, jobseekers and professionals seeking a career change.
